### Mom, Dad and Summer Reading

Over the years I have heard many parents say that they don't know how to get their children to read during summer vacation.

Some might try to force their children to read: "You're not leaving the house unless you've read 100 pages." Others might try coercion: "If you read this book I'll take you shopping for new clothes." Sometimes we use fear: "You'll have a test on this book the first week of school."

Here is another way to encourage your children that is much more peaceful and often leads to the desired outcome — children who see their parents reading tend to become motivated readers.

Try delaying dinner by an hour this summer so you can finish reading a great book. Your children, and your spouse, will wonder

what's so good about that book that dinner is late. Instead of doing the laundry find a nice shady tree and get lost in a book. Tell your children you can't drive them to the mall because you have to find out if Stephanie Plum and Joe

Morelli catch the bad guys.

Children are inspired to read when their parents read with them. If your children are assigned reading for school this summer, read with them. Shared reading makes for great conversation. While sitting in traffic you can ask your children "So who is Pearl's Father?", or

"What kind of a name is Pip?", or "How about that pig! It got a spider to save its' bacon."

Inspire your children this summer by being the reader you want them to be!


