From the Director's Desk: *Front Stairs and Portico*

The front stairs of the library are being replaced, and a portico is being built to cover them. A rendering of the portico can be seen in the library lobby area. These changes will make a safer entry to the library. The nose of each stair has been slowly crumbling, leading to a portion of the stairs being closed earlier this year. During the winter snow and ice accumulates on the stairs making them slippery and unsafe to use.

The replacement is expected to begin on Monday June 6th. The Library will remain open during the work on the stairs and the erection of the portico. The work is expected to be completed in 6 to 8 weeks. The contractor will build a guardrail at the top of the stairs so that people may enter the library as they normally would, through the main entry. Additionally, the entrance on the north side of the building will be open if people wish to avoid the construction area.

The approximate cost of the project is \$174,000.00. The cost is being paid with funds that the Library Trustees have saved for projects such as this. The replacement of the stairs and the new portico are the first steps in an eventual full renovation of the front of the library building.

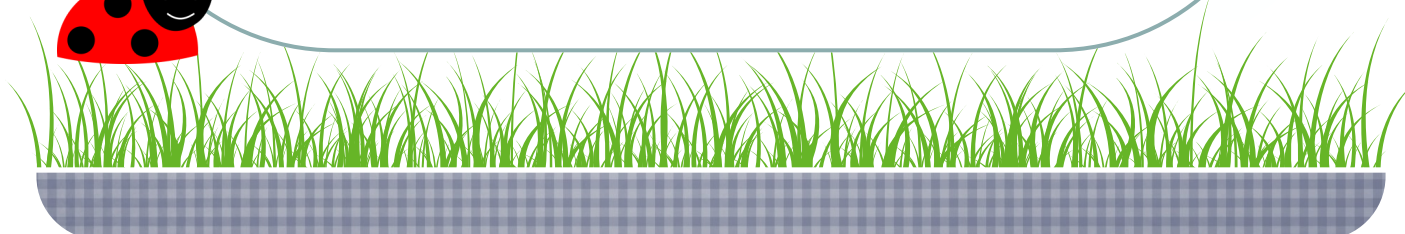

It's Summer Reading Time!

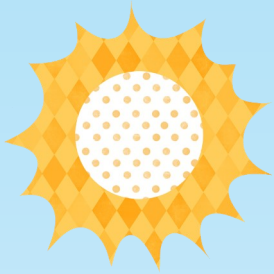

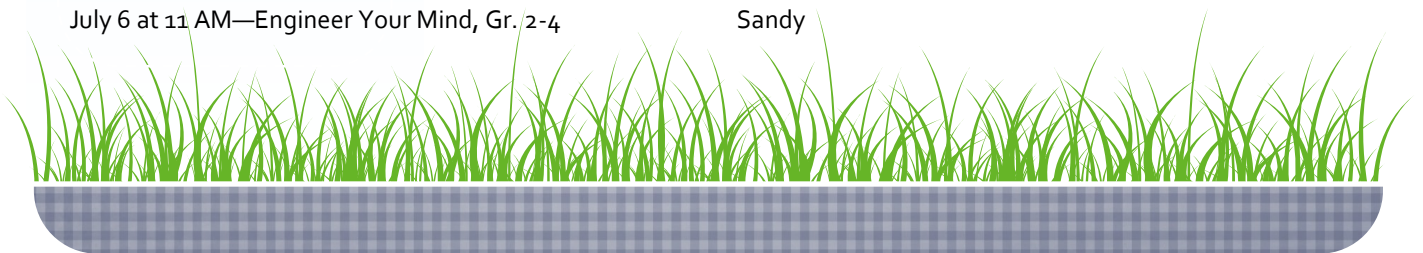

Bertie Plays the Blues by Alexander McCall Smith
